More than 3 in 4 Oro Valley households have responded to the 2020 Census, the highest response percentage in Arizona, according to the U.S. Census Bureau. Oro Valley's rate is 75.8 percent. Sahuarita is second in Arizona at 73.9 percent. Marana comes in at 67.3 percent. The state's rate is 59.8 percent.

Updated totals change numbers, not results for Oro Valley council

Vote totals have been updated in the 5-way bid for 3 seats on the Oro Valley Town Council.

Numbers have changed, but the unofficial results have not; Oro Valley voters have reelected Councilman Steve Solomon, and seated first-time candidates Dr. Harry "Mo" Greene II and Tim Bohen on the council. Solomon leads all candidates with 7,360 votes,



as posted by the Pima County Recorder's Office
Friday morning. Greene was second at **7,355**; Bohen, third, **7,159**;
incumbent **Bill Rodman** fourth, **7,085**; and **Bill Garner** fifth, **6,955**. There were **85** write-in votes.

To determine the outcome, add all the votes cast for the 5 candidates, then divide by the number of open seats, 3. That number is then divided in half, to indicate the **50 percent threshold**. Any candidate who receives 50 percent of the votes, plus at least 1 vote, is elected. Official results are expected to be determined after a canvass next week. By a vote of **8,499-4,497** (**65-35 percent**) Oro Valley voters **passed Proposition 480**, setting a permanent base adjustment in the town's budget expenditure limit.
