# Effort aims to keep community, workers safe, business viable

The Town of Oro Valley, in conjunction with the Greater Oro Valley Chamber of Commerce, has launched OVSafeSteps, a business assistance program that can financially benefit local businesses struggling during the pandemic.

With the understanding that a **healthy community** leads to a **healthy economy**, the program provides valuable resources while asking businesses and community members to comply with health guidelines with a pledge to keep Oro Valley **safe**, **responsible** and **open**.

"OVSafeSteps was created to help our local businesses, and also to recognize that each of us has a role in reducing the spread of COVID-19. We need to work together and commit to responsible actions to move forward. This program will benefit businesses, and it will also benefit residents who are interested in supporting our businesses," said Mayor Joe Winfield.

All businesses in the greater Oro Valley area are invited and encouraged to participate in the **OVSafeSteps** program, which provides **free signage** and **inclusion** in the program's website, **www.ovsafesteps.com**. Additional resources are also available to qualifying **small businesses** with fewer than **50** employees.

Qualifying local businesses will receive:

- **PPE** reimbursement
- Marketing support
- One-on-one coaching in areas such as technology, finance, human resources and legal



All businesses in Oro Valley area are invited and encouraged to participate in the OVSafeSteps program, which provides free signage and inclusion in the program's website, <a href="https://www.ovsafesteps.com">www.ovsafesteps.com</a>. Additional resources are also available to qualifying small businesses with fewer than 50 employees.

Those qualifying local businesses will receive PPE reimbursement, marketing support, and 1:1 coaching in areas such as technology, finance, human resources and legal needs. Your Chamber is helping match qualifying businesses with the right coaches for their business needs.

OVSafeSteps also calls upon the **community** to help keep Oro Valley safe while patronizing local businesses. The website features local businesses and the precautions they are taking to ensure a safe shopping or dining experience. Patrons can then search and filter the results to find a local business or restaurant that meets their needs.

For example, not everyone is ready to dine in a restaurant yet, but many people are comfortable eating outside on the patio or doing curb-side pickup. OVSafeSteps can help you find the restaurants that offer patio dining and pickup.

"We all have a role in the fight against COVID-19, and by committing to responsible actions we show care, consideration and appreciation for our community," a release said. "Together we can do our best to keep our town healthy and safe as we move forward."

### Funding for the program

This assistance is made possible by the Town of Oro Valley's allocation of **CARES Act funding** from the state of Arizona.

The Town received more than **\$5 million** in funding to alleviate the business-related impacts of COVID-19, such as regular payroll costs of public safety and public health personnel.

As a result, some of the Town's previously-allocated general funds were freed up to support other local government priorities. Understanding the **economic peril** that our local businesses face, and the impact that would have on our quality of life, the **Oro Valley Town Council** authorized \$1 million in the FY20-21 budget to support the local business community during COVID-19.





Arizona Central, which has its office on the north side of Ina at Foothills Mall, continues to follow CDC guidelines and social distancing requirements for the safety of its members and staff.

### Northwest Medical Center, Oro Valley Hospital, affiliates to allow some visitation

In response to the presence of COVID-19, Northwest Medical Center, Oro Valley Hospital and Northwest Healthcare affiliated clinics are



implementing a **restricted** hospital and clinic patient visitor policy for all medical sites effective this **Monday**, **Sept. 21**, at **8 a.m**.

Visitation will be allowed as follows:

**Inpatients** are allowed to have 1 visitor between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. Visitors must stay in the patient's room, and may not congregate in lobby areas. The **cafeteria** is **closed** to visitors;

**Emergency room** patients are allowed 1 visitor at bedside only; **Outpatient** surgery patients are allowed 1 visitor at discharge only. Visitor will be called when patient is nearing discharge to assist with discharge instructions;

**Labor**, **delivery** and **postpartum** patients are allowed 1 adult support person, and may have one additional visitor;

**NICU** babies are allowed 2 adult visitors, who must remain the same through the entire stay;

**Pediatric** patients in other areas of the hospital / clinics can have 1 parent or adult caregiver with them;

End-of-life patients are allowed 1 visitor.

All other visitation at Northwest facilities remains **suspended**. Additional visitors essential to patient care will be considered on a **case-by-case** basis.

Visitation is allowed for **non-COVID-19** patients only.

All visitors will be **screened** and have their temperatures taken. All visitors are **required** to wear a **mask**.

### 450K property tax bills

Pima County has begun sending 2020 property tax statements to approximately 450,000 individuals, businesses and other organizations.

While there are 94 taxing jurisdictions reflected on the bills, Pima County has direct responsibility for four of them: the county's



**primary property tax**, which pays for general operations, and the county's **three secondary property taxes** that pay for the county library district, regional flood control district, and payments on county debt service.

The rate for Pima County's primary property tax **decreased** by **\$0.0776** for 2020-'21 and the county debt service tax rate **decreased** by **\$0.1700**. Rates for the regional flood control district and the county library district remain **unchanged**. The result is a **total decrease** of **\$0.2476 per \$100** of net assessed value for Pima County taxing jurisdictions.

The county's <u>property tax website</u> contains helpful tools to assist in understanding property tax statements. Taxpayers can access the current year tax levies and rates for each taxing jurisdiction within Pima County. Also available are current and select prior year tax rates by tax area code, sources and uses of tax dollars, frequently asked questions, and other tools for taxpayer assistance.




