# OV increases ovsafesteps reimbursements for PPE, marketing expenditures

To date, **79 businesses** have made the promise. In return, they're receiving a window cling, a poster, access to floor decals, free digital marketing and the opportunity to be reimbursed for pandemic-related expenses. If you've already been reimbursed, you can receive more funds.



### La Cholla now open

**All four lanes** of the new, expanded **La Cholla Boulevard** are **open** to traffic between Overton and Tangerine in Oro Valley, according to a release from the town of Oro Valley.

Traffic control has been **removed**, and the speed limit is **45 mph**. **Minor work** on the **3.5-mile** project will continue for several weeks, the release said. "A big shout-out to everyone living on or near La Cholla Boulevard who has been impacted by the construction," it continued. "Thank you for your patience."

The new La Cholla is 4 lanes with a landscaped median, turn lanes, traffic signals, a 1-way frontage road for some residential access, bicycle and multi-use paths with ADA access, drainage improvements, wildlife crossings and retaining walls.

The town **thanked** its partners on the project, to include the Regional Transportation Authority, Pima County, AECOM and Hunter Contracting, "for all of their work and support on this project."

businesses. Priority in this round goes to businesses applying for the **first time**. Businesses that already obtained PPE through this program **can** submit another request and receive supplies, if still available.

Businesses requesting assistance will receive a **pre-sorted allotment** of PPE – which may include hand sanitizer, gloves, and masks – based on their number of employees. This service is only available to businesses with **fewer** than 50 employees.

The <u>application link</u> is open until **Oct. 30**. PPE distribution to businesses will begin the week of **Nov. 2**. This is a **first-come**, **first-served** program, and requests will be filled until PPE runs out for the County's allotment of business assistance.

# On Jan. 1, state minimum wage goes to \$12.15

Arizona's minimum wage will increase by **15 cents** per hour on **Jan. 1, 2021**, rising from \$12 to **\$12.15**.

In 2016, Arizona voters imposed a \$10 per hour minimum wage with substantial increases included for the next few years.

In accordance with the Arizona Fair Wages and Healthy Families Act (Prop 206), beginning in 2021, the annual increase is to be determined by the

Consumer Price Index, which is measured in August of the previous year.

In August of 2020, the Consumer Price Index increased by **1.3%**, and this translates to a **15 cent** increase for the hourly minimum wage in Arizona at the beginning of the next calendar year (2021).



# County has up to \$10K in support for a small business

Pima County has opened a **grant program** to assist **small businesses** in unincorporated regions that have faced difficulties during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.



The Pima County CARES for Small

**Business Grant Program** is providing provide grants **up to \$10,000** for qualifying small businesses and nonprofit organizations. The program has a total budget **of \$1.7 million**, provided from the County's allocation of federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act funding.

Qualifying businesses can use the grant funds to pay for expenses related to **mortgage payments**, **rent costs**, **lease payments**, and **utility expenses**. Grants awards can be applied to **past** expenses only, not future or ongoing expenses.

Grants will be awarded on a **first-come**, **first-serve** basis. The application process is open to small businesses in the unincorporated areas outside of the cities and towns.


