

Funds available for certain biz to pay rents, mortgages

Gyms, fitness centers, movies theaters, certain liquor license holders and water parks impacted by the pandemic are being **encouraged** to seek help toward **rent** and **mortgage** assistance.

Through a partnership with the Local First Arizona Foundation, the Arizona Small Business Rent and Mortgage Relief Grant program will help struggling small businesses in Arizona meet their rent or mortgage obligations, with a focus on those most in need and without access to other resources.

According to a release, **\$1.5 million remains** in a fund provided by Arizona's Crisis Contingency and Safety Net Fund for Arizona small businesses required to pause operations due to state executive orders. Businesses with **fewer** than **50 employees** are given priority. The maximum award is **2 months rent**, capped at **\$25,000**.


ADOT calls for bids on Oracle

The **Arizona Department** of Transportation is seeking contractor proposals to reconstruct pavement, including street lights, sidewalks, and the construction of additional northbound left-turn lanes at the Magee intersection. On Jan. 1, state minimum wage goes to \$12.15

Arizona's minimum wage will increase by **15 cents** per hour on **Jan. 1, 2021**, rising from \$12 to **\$12.15**.

In 2016, Arizona voters imposed a \$10 per hour minimum wage with substantial increases included for the next few years.

In accordance with the Arizona Fair Wages and Healthy Families Act (Prop 206), beginning in 2021, the annual increase is to be determined by the

Consumer Price Index,

which is measured in August of the previous year. In August of 2020, the

Consumer Price Index increased by 1.3%, and this translates to a 15 cent increase for the hourly minimum wage in Arizona at the beginning of the next calendar year (2021).

Releasing the new, increased minimum wage in September allows employers to begin **budgeting** for 2021.



\$10K in support for a small business

Pima County has opened a **grant program** to assist **small businesses** in unincorporated regions that have faced difficulties during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.



The Pima County CARES for Small

Business Grant Program is providing provide grants **up to \$10,000** for qualifying small businesses and nonprofit organizations. The program has a total budget **of \$1.7 million**, provided from the County's allocation of federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act funding.
